CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

Bill Harris, a long time Mission resident and former Mayor, saw a need through which Mission residents would be able to leave funds, in perpetuity, for the long term benefit of the community and it's citizens. Such a vehicle was available through a charitable foundation. Consequently the Mission Foundation came into being through an Act of the Provincial Legislature, June 18th, 1987, with Bill Harris as the first and founding Chairman.

The first funds entrusted to the Foundation came through the Estate of the late Margaret Erskine originally left to the District of Mission and subsequently assigned to the Foundation in the amount of \$228,000. Subsequently, 22 other funds have been added, with \$676,204 currently under administration, an increase of 7.19% over 1995.

There are ongoing enquiries, several choosing the Foundation as a recipient of memorial donations. Starting this year, memorial donations to other than specified funds, will be placed into a Community Fund, the capital held in perpetuity, the income going into the community within the objectives of the Foundation. The donor's names will be recorded for posterity. A donation to the Foundation via the Community Fund is also an ideal way to place either your personal or corporate annual charitable giving. The Mission community will benefit from your thoughtful donation.

Mission Foundation assets are held with Wood Gundy, the Trustee which invests in accordance with a recently adopted Investment Policy. This policy is available for examination as are all policies of the Foundation, it being very much a public body. Investments are directed by Albert McMahon, Victor Hollister, Bill Harris, John Weisgerber, Don Calnek and Doug Parkinson.

Unlike many organizations and societies, Mission Foundation has no members as such, or membership. As stipulated in the Act, there is an appointed Board of six being Dr. Keith Wong - Dr. Robert Marshall - Sandy Goold - Don Calnek - Gordon Taylor and Doug Parkinson. That Board is supported by five appointees - Mission Memorial Hospital, Eleanor Lobb - Fraser Valley Regional District, Roxann McKamey - School District No. 75, Rosemary Nemanishen - Mission Regional Chamber of Commerce, P. Gordon Wood and District of Mission, Councillor Karen Potter. All are volunteers who in addition to Board duties serve on a number of committees, assisted by Marie Waters as Executive Assistant.

Since opening with the Erskine fund of \$228,000, an additional 22 Community Funds have been added with three being in the past year - these are: the Gerry Potter Memorial Fund - G. W. - (Bill) Harris Fund and the Community Fund as previously mentioned. Through 1995, Mission Foundation has paid out \$175,147 in Scholarships and \$92,175 in other grants. With completion of the 1996 audit, scholarships will top \$200,000 and grants will exceed \$100,000. Amounts included in the grants have been \$21,775 to the Mission Community Archives, \$2,000 to the Hatzic Secondary School Choir to attend a choir festival in Europe to mention just two.

Additionally, the Foundation underwrote the writing, publishing and printing of the book "Carved From Wood", the community's Centennial Project, at a cost of \$52,285, while also matching funds of \$25,000 amongst five designated funds. In spite of that and the 296% increase in the Foundations asset base, our growth must be increased in order to serve a growing Municipality, a third high school and increasing community needs.

When I speak of Foundation funds, these have been made possible through the generous support of community members who have really made the Foundation activities possible. There are a number of ways one may support the Foundation, tax receipts issued in every case. A few ways are:

- a donor directed fund, with an opening balance of \$10,000 required in most cases;
- a cash donation which now will go to the Community Fund, such a donation perhaps annually and perhaps personally or a planned Corporate pledge;
- a donation of shares which have a better tax break, valued for tax purposes at 37.5% rather than at 75%.

In all cases discuss your position first with your Tax advisor and then with a member of the Foundation Board.

A donation and/or establishment of a fund with the Foundation is a gift that will truly go on giving while also perpetuating your family name.

The Mission Foundation is also a member of Community Foundations of Canada, representing in excess of \$750,000,000 in Foundation assets. We are then able to access that vast network of resources.

This again is National Volunteer recognition week and I wish to acknowledge the contributions of all the volunteers through-out our community and in particular those who have served the Foundation both in the past and presently without whom there be no Foundation and other projects with our community. We must not take volunteers for granted, but create an atmosphere where participation and innovation are encouraged and recognized.

I extend best wishes to the incoming Board and to the Foundation. I have enjoyed my 10 years with the Foundation and reaching \$1 Million under administration by the end of the millennium is, in my opinion attainable. A seat on the Board will then be a much sought after position.

Notes to Financial Statements

Date: December 31, 1996

Nature of operations:

Mission Foundation is a non-profit society incorporated under the Mission Foundation Act and is a registered charitable organization.

1. Significant accounting policies:

a) Basis of presentation:

The Foundation's financial activities are reported on the basis of fund accounting, where resources designated for specific purposes are segregated into separate funds (Notes 3).

b) Revenue and expenditure recognition:

All funds are accounted for on a full accrual basis, except as follows:

- awards and grants are recognized when disbursed;
- donation revenue is recognized when received

c) Investments:

Portfolio investments are recorded at cost, or at cost less amounts written off to reflect decline in value which is other than temporary. Premiums or discounts on the purchase of fixed terms securities are amortized over the period to maturity.

d) Capital:

The capital of the Foundation is segregated as follows:

Distributable capital - represents the cumulative undistributed income of each fund, less transfers, if any, to restricted capital. The distributable capital if the General Fund may be spent at the discretion of the Foundation. The distributable capital of all other funds must be spent with the terms and restrictions specified by specific donors.

Restricted capital - represents contributions, and transfers from distributable capital which are to be maintained in perpetuity.

e) Donated services:

The value of donated services is recorded as donation revenue with an offsetting administrative expenditure in the General Fund.

f) Statement of changes in financial position:

The financial statements do not contain a statement of changes in financial position because it would not provide any meaningful information.

g) Income taxes:

The Foundation is exempt from federal and provincial income taxes.

3. Description of funds:

a) General Fund:

All revenue, expenditures and capital of the Foundation which are not subject to terms and restrictions by donors are recorded in the General Fund.

b) Margaret Erskine Bursary Fund:

The Margaret Erskine Bursary Fund is a permanent fund established to provide bursaries to students who have shown outstanding abilities in their particular field of endeavor, either in school or in an outside avocation in the fields of athletics, education, music or the arts and sciences.

c) Hollister Prize for Earth Sciences Fund:

The Hollister Prize for Earth Sciences Fund is a permanent fund established to provide financial assistance to one student annually who will be pursuing advanced study in earth sciences.

Description of funds (continued):

d) Hollister Scholarship for Basic Sciences Fund

The Hollister Scholarship for Basic Sciences Fund is a permanent fund established to provide financial assistance to two students annually who will be pursuing advanced study in chemistry, physics or mathematics.

e) Hollister Scholarship for Engineering Fund

The Hollister Scholarship for Engineering Fund is a permanent fund established to provide financial assistance to two students annually who will be pursuing advanced study in civil, mechanical or electrical engineering.

f) Jonson Bequest Fund:

The is a permanent fund established to provide assistance for drug and alcohol abuse, and to provide assistance for students studying gymnastics or dance.

g) Library Fund:

The Library Fund is a permanent fund established to maintain furnishings, collections and equipment in the Mission library.

h) Lobb Shake & Shingle Fund:

The Lobb Shake & Shingle Fund is a permanent fund established in memory of Clinton Lobb to provide financial assistance to students pursuing a career in aviation or forestry.

i) Albert McMahon Mission City Rotary Club Fund:

The Albert McMahon Mission City Rotary Club Fund is a permanent fund established to provide financial assistance to students in special circumstances and in need of help.

j) George Willoughby Cooke Fund:

The George Willoughby Cooke Fund is a permanent fund established to provide academic achievement awards in math and sciences to two grade seven students in each of the Mission district schools.

k) Youth Centre Fund:

The Youth Centre Fund is a permanent fund established to provide financial assistance for the Mission Youth Centre.

Mission Memorial Hospital Study Fund:

The Mission Memorial Hospital Study Fund is a permanent fund established to assist in the upgrading and modernization of skills of health care workers employed by or associated with the Mission Memorial Hospital.

m) Enabling Fund:

The Enabling Fund is a permanent fund established to assist the Mission Foundation in covering operating and administrative costs.

n) James Slusarchuk Fund:

The James Slasarchuk Fund is a permanent fund established to provide scholarships.

o) Hollister Entry Level UCFV Science Fund (Hatzic):

The Hatzic Entry Level Science Fund is a permanent fund established to provide financial assistance to one graduating student of Hatzic Secondary School pursuing post-secondary education in the field of science at UCFV.

p) Hollister Entry Level UCFV Science Fund (Mission):

The Mission Entry Level Science Fund is a permanent fund established to provide financial assistance to one graduating student of Mission Secondary School pursuing post-secondary education in the field of science at UCFV.

q) Beaton Patience Drug and Alcohol Abuse Fund:

The Beaton Patience Drug and Alcohol Abuse Fund is a permanent fund established to provide financial assistance in the area of drug and alcohol abuse prevention, care and treatment.

r) Glen Kask Theatrical Legacy Fund:

The Glen Kask Theatrical Legacy Fund is a permanent fund established to assist in the promotion of the performing arts.

s) Mission Life Time Learning Association Fund:

The Mission Life Time Learning Association Fund is a permanent fund established to provide financial assistance to the Life Time Learning Association.

t) Dirk Boswyk Fund:

The Dirk Boswyk Fund is a permanent fund established to provide financial assistance to students in the area of computer science.

u) Cindy Verhulst Fund:

The Cindy Verhuylst Fund is a permanent fund established to provide financial assistance to students in the area of music.
